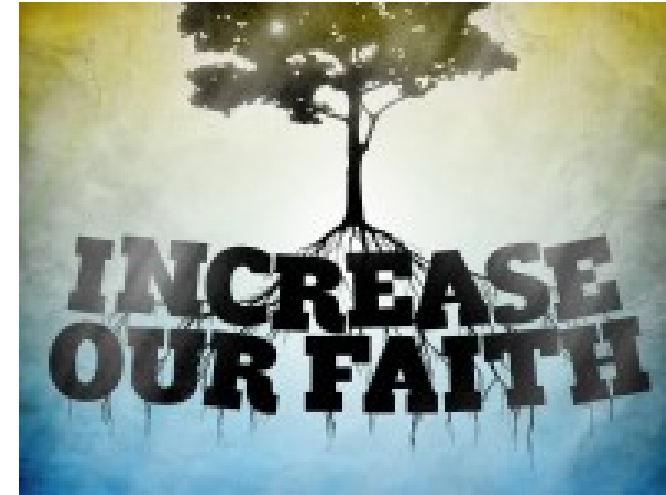

Welcome to the Lord’s Table—On the first Sunday of each month, we gather to celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Communion. So that both our teachers and our older elementary aged children may join with our community to participate in the sacrament, our children (ages 3- grade 6) will not be dismissed for class on the first Sunday of each month. Nursery care remains available for infants through children, age three. All who have been baptized and trust in the Lord Jesus Christ and invited are welcomed to the Lord’s Table. At their parent’s discretion, "Baptized children who are being nurtured and instructed in the significance of the invitation to the Table and the meaning of their response are invited to receive the Lord's Supper, recognizing that their understanding of participation will vary according to their maturity.
